
RCPP CRISIS TO OPPORTUNITY

District Rule 4901 and the associated Residential Wood Smoke Reduction Program help reduce fine-particulate matter (PM2.5) when winter air quality is forecast to deteriorate. Achieving additional emissions reductions from residential wood burning is necessary for the Valley to meet federal PM2.5 health standards and improve public health.

DRIVER/OPERATOR WANTED

Tulare County RCD Water Tender Driver/ Operator



Job description:

- Drive and operate a water tender on active fires.
- Water tender to support fire agency suppression efforts.
- Work shifts "may" be up to 24 hours per shift.
- Must follow instructions and be a self-starter.Mechanical ability a must.

- Commitment time for work may be extended, i.e. days, weeks or up to a month.
- Driver must provide their personal gear, i.e. change of clothes and toiletries.
- Applicant must provide their own lugged sole- 8 inch high lace up boots.

Qualifications for a driver would include:

- CDL class "A" or "B" license with "tanker" endorsement.
- Current Cal Fire and USFS "8-hour Safety Training" certificate.
- Fire experience preferable.

CALIFORNIA FOREST IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FUNDING ANNOUNCED \$18 million in funding for the next 3 years

The purpose of the California Forest Improvement Program (CFIP) is to encourage private and public investment in, and improved management of, California forest lands and resources. This focus is to ensure adequate high quality timber supplies, related employment and other economic benefits, and the protection, maintenance, and enhancement of a productive and stable forest resource system for the benefit of present and future generations.

The CFIP application periods end on the following dates:

1. October 30, 2021 2. December 30, 2021 More on CFIP

Forestry Assistance 3. February 28, 2022 4. April 30, 2022 5. June 30, 2022
